The Club must have completed and submitted to their SKA, their COVIDSafe Action Plan for all facilities.

COVID-19 ACKNOWLEDGEMENT AND VOLUNTARY ACCEPTANCE OF RISK

3. SPECIFIC COVID-19 RESTRICTION AND MITIGATION REQUIREMENTS

<p>THE CLUB HAS COMPLETED A COVIDSafe ACTION PLAN</p> <p>The Plan has been submitted to Karting Tas. and where required by law, to the relevant State Government Department. All actions identified as being required to be done to create a COVIDSafe Event and Club facility must be carried prior to and during the Event.</p>	
1.	PERMITTED AND NON-PERMITTED PERSONS
1.1.	No person who has symptoms consistent with COVID-19 (this includes any fever, respiratory symptoms, shortness of breath, sore throat, cough, lack of smell or fatigue) is permitted to attend the Circuit or participate in the Event.
1.2.	Any person who starts to feel unwell or to exhibit symptoms of COVID-19 during the Event must immediately avoid contact with all persons at the Circuit and MUST IMMEDIATELY LEAVE the Circuit.
1.3.	<p>Note - The Organising Club must ensure that the maximum number of people (the combined total of Essential Personnel and Permitted Persons) permitted to gather in total at an Event and in groups in accordance with State Public Health Authority Orders/Directions/Regulations is not exceeded at any time prior to or during the Event.</p> <p>Essential Karting Personnel is defined as:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Club President, Vice President, Treasurer, Secretary; and • COVIDSafe Officer • Essential Officials identified in Section 1.7 and 1.8 of these Regulations • First Aid Attendant; and • Administration and Access Control Attendant/s • Event Operations staff (includes but is not limited to canteen staff, cleaners etc).
1.4.	<p>Permitted Persons</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A Licensed Driver (Driver) who has booked their entry in the Event plus a maximum of Unlimited other people per kart who must be either: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ The Parent, Legal Guardian, or family member of the Driver; or ○ The Participant License Holder for the Driver; or ○ A Mechanic whose sole task it is, is to prepare, adjust, repair the kart as may be required; • A Person who is approved by the Club to supply karting components and provide specialised karting service to any Permitted Persons in attendance at the Activity.
1.5.	<p>Non-Permitted Persons</p> <p>SPECTATORS are permitted to be in attendance.</p>
2.	SOCIAL DISTANCING AND DENSITY REQUIRMENTS (Note - the number chosen in 2.1 <u>must not exceed the maximum number of people permitted to gather under Government Directions.</u>)
2.1.	Essential Karting Personnel and Permitted Persons are not permitted to gather in groups greater than 100.
2.2.	Government prescribed Social Distancing measures must be observed at all times.
2.3.	The use by Permitted Persons of any indoor facilities is strictly limited by the Density Quotient of the room as included in the Club's COVIDSafe Action Plan.
3.	KARTING AUSTRALIA COVID-19 DECLARATION
3.1.	<p>Under NO circumstances is ANYONE who has been overseas, or in a declared COVID-19 hotspot, in the previous 14 days or been in contact with a person who is known to be COVID-19 positive, permitted to attend the Circuit.</p> <p>All Essential Karting Personnel and Permitted Persons MUST complete the compulsory State Government issued QR Code Check-In or use the contact tracing record sheets that are provided around the deck/clubrooms, before the commencement time of the Event.</p>
4.	HYGIENE FACILITIES - TOILET/WASHROOM FACILITIES and HAND SANITISER
4.1.	The Club is required to provide facilities to ensure general and sensible hygiene practices are maintained.
4.2.	Toilet and washroom facilities at the Circuit must be open and available for use.
4.3.	<p>Washroom facilities must be properly equipped with liquid soap, running water and either air hand driers or paper towels.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The toilets and washroom facilities must be cleaned at least once during the day or as otherwise required in accordance with the Club's COVIDSafe Action Plan

4.4.	It is strongly recommended that Essential Karting Personnel and Permitted Persons bring their own supply of hand sanitiser for use in accordance with government recommendations in addition to hand sanitiser that is supplied by the Club.
5.	HYGIENE - NON-SHARING OF EQUIPMENT
5.1.	The sharing of any equipment including but not limited to tools, apparel, safety equipment, pens is not permitted.

3. COMPETITION

1.	FORMAT OF RACING	
1.1.	Practice	2 Practice session of 6 Minutes will be held.
1.2.	Qualifying	There will be one (1) standalone Qualifying session of 6 minutes. The order of Karts on the grid for the commencement of Qualifying must be random – no high/low numbers)
1.3.	Racing	Race 1 - All drivers' fastest times from Qualifying, Fastest to Pole, second fastest to second, etc. Race 2 - All drivers' fastest times from Qualifying, Fastest to Pole, second fastest to second, etc. Race 3 - Race Results from Race 1, Winner to pole, second to second, etc. Race 4 - Race Results from Race 2, Winner to pole, second to second, etc. Race 5 - Highest Points from Races 1, 2, 3 & 4 to Pole, second highest to second, etc.
1.4.	Point System	The point score used will be the "401 System". 1 st - 401, 2 nd - 361, 3 rd - 325, 4 th - 293, 5 th - 264, 6 th - 238, 7 th - 215, 8 th - 194, 9 th - 175, 10 th - 158 11 th - 143, 12 th - 129, 13 th - 117, 14 th - 106, 15 th - 96, 16 th - 87, 17 th - 79, 18 th - 71, 19 th - 64, 20 th - 58 21 st - 52, 22 nd - 47, 23 rd - 43, 24 th - 39, 25 th - 34, 26 th - 32, 27 th - 29, 28 th - 26, 29 th - 24, 30 th - 22 DNF will be awarded a finishing position on the number of laps completed. They will then be awarded the number of points partnered with that finishing position, as long as they have successfully made their way through the in grid and weighed in. If they do not, they will forfeit all points for that race. DSQ and DNS will be awarded 0 points. Please note the definition of DNS can be found under National Competition Rules - Page 22 of the 2021 Karting Australia Manual.
1.5.	Black Plate	A black plate will be awarded to the driver who accumulates the most points from the five races over the race weekend.
1.6.	Tiebreaker	In the event of a tie, drivers will be separated by most wins, then most seconds etc. If two or more drivers are still equal after the first tiebreaker the competitor with the higher finishing position from race five will be awarded the higher overall placing.

3.	ACCESS TO CIRCUIT	
3.1.	Competitors WILL NOT be given access to the track for practice from 8:00am Monday 22 nd to Friday 26 th November at 2:59pm.	
3.2.	Competitors will be permitted to enter the circuit from 7:00am on both Saturday 27 th and Sunday 28 th November.	
3.3.	All Essential Karting Personnel and Permitted Persons MUST complete the compulsory State Government issued QR Code Check-In or use the contact tracing record sheets that are provided around the deck/clubrooms, before the commencement time of the Event.	
4.	DRIVERS BRIEFING	
4.1.	Drivers Briefing will be held on the grassed area near the canteen and will also be announced over the PA System. Any questions should be directed to the Clerk of Course or Chief Steward prior to the start of Competition.	

5.	SCRUTINEERING	
5.1.	All Competitors will be required to complete an electronic Scrutineering Form https://kartingaustralia.wufoo.com/forms/ka-scrutineering-record-launceston	
5.2.	This form will be submitted to the Race Secretary in an electronic format and need to be received no later than 12:00pm on Friday 26 th November 2021.	
5.3.	Drivers whose scrutineering forms aren't completed within the above timeframe will have their entry removed. They will then not be eligible to compete and no refund will be given unless contacting the Race Secretary prior.	
5.4.	Scrutineering Stickers will be available for collection from the Scrutineering shed between 8:30am and 11:30am on Saturday 27 th of November.	
5.5.	All drivers MUST have a scrutineering sticker on their karts prior to racing.	
6.	FUEL	
6.1.	PULP is the only fuel permitted to be used at this Meeting.	
6.2.	Control Fuel Will be used at this Meeting and all Classes and Divisions must only use the Control Fuel detailed in these Supplementary Regulations	
6.3.	Control Fuel for use at this meeting must be purchased from: BP Service Station, Newnham 117 George Town Road, Newnham, Tasmania, 7248 BP Ultimate Unleaded 98	
6.4.	Control Fuel for this meeting can be purchased from Friday 26 th of November 2021 onwards.	
6.5.	Proof of purchase receipts for the Fuel MUST be retained and produced to the Chief Scrutineer or Fuel Tester if required.

3.	KART RETRIEVAL
3.1.	Pit Crew with trolleys will not be given access to the Circuit during Practice, Qualifying and Racing.
3.2.	Retrieval of Karts is at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course
3.3.	Pit Crew must only enter the Circuit when permitted by the Grid Marshal and then only if wearing a HIGH VISIBILITY SAFETY VEST on the upper torso.
3.4.	Karts can be retrieved via the out-grid gate only. All drivers must then proceed to the in-grid area and weigh in to receive points. If they do not, they will forfeit all points for that race.
4.	ADDITIONAL VENUE REQUIREMENTS
4.1.	Subject to any applicable laws which may govern the access of animals, including but not limited to guide dogs, no animals are allowed anywhere within the facility.
4.2.	No dumping of Fuel or Tyres, please make own arrangements.
4.3.	No unlicensed driving of motor vehicles permitted at the Circuit.
4.4.	No motorised scooters, mini bikes, roller blading, skateboards and tricycles allowed at the complex during the entire Meeting. Officials may confiscate any such items for the duration of the Meeting.
4.5.	Marquees are not to be erected without consent of the Club.
4.6.	Limited camping is permitted for this race meeting. Those intending to stay at the track will need to contact Jade Stone (0400 057 290) and give a list of who will be staying. Contact details will need to be provided so they can be passed onto the responsible people. Please note Patrina Synfield and Garry Lee will be the responsible people while staying at the circuit. Access to the clubrooms will not be permitted.
